#### • Bill S.2703 enacted as a State Holiday

On July 22, 2022 Governor Charlie Baker signed Bill S. 2703 into law as a State Holiday. The unsigned version was brought to Negro Election Day festival for announcement of Status.

#### • Return of Negro Election Day

Without the pandemic stagnating us, Salem United was able to return to hosting the 282<sup>nd</sup> Negro Election Day festival to its original format.

#### • Unmasking of Negro Election Day Exhibition and the Black Vote

Salem United hosted the Exhibition Program at Lynn Museum. We began the exhibit in 2021 but dismantled it in 2022. We used QR Codes to educate on a daily basis. This opportunity allowed us to bring the history outside of Salem MA and bring it to other areas. Chronicle, Channel 5, attended to amplify the history. Local print covered the exhibit.

#### • Community Involvement

Salem United participated in both Haunted Happenings and Gay pride Day parades. We wanted the community to know that Salem United believes in unity not division.

#### • Workshops and Seminars

Salem United was invited to speak at workshops and seminars, telling the story of Negro Election Day. We worked with the LGBTQ community and taught Kwanzaa at an organization called NAGLY in Salem MA. Salem Untied was invited to attend zoom lectures at schools in Salem MA
