

## PRESERVATION HISTORY



Negro Election Day's history is a powerful story of turning tragedy into triumph. These men climbed out of slavery to accomplish something, a democracy, not practiced in this country as it was under the British rule. It shows that Negro Election Day was practiced years before the declaration of independence was signed.

These men who were portrayed in many cases as less than animals, not human, void of education. Unable to do anything the white man could do.

Even as enslaved men, they found a way to contribute to American history by fighting in every way.

These enslaved African's called it Negro Election Day after the land they were stolen from; Negroland, many from West Africa, Ghana.

- 1. The Government Day was cancelled because of the weather in the month of February.
- 2. The Mayor of the city of Salem stating that they would not allow Salem United to raise funds or collect money from their vendors in order to use Salem Willows Park.
- 3. Low turnout from Government officials for the black community.
- 4. Program 5: Youth Board was not able to come together because many young peple were kept from being involved.
- 5. The City of Salem began to stop the growth of the exhibit when they decided to censor the exhibit due to the real life pictures and because of the noose.
